Passengers often wrote about things that were affecting them during the voyage, with poems about love, the journey and missing home proving popular topics. One passenger even wrote one about their missing hat!

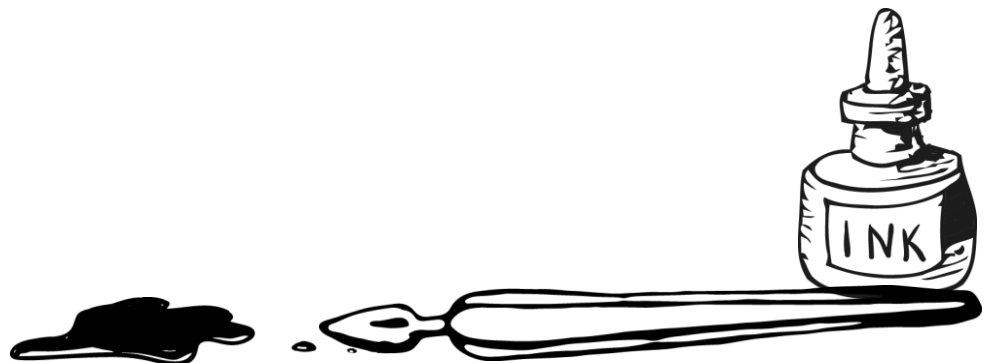
Today the *SS Great Britain* still inspires people to create poetry. Watch poet Sali Katebe perform [After '70](#) and [She Made it Back](#).

- Pick one of the words on the following pages and write an acrostic poem.



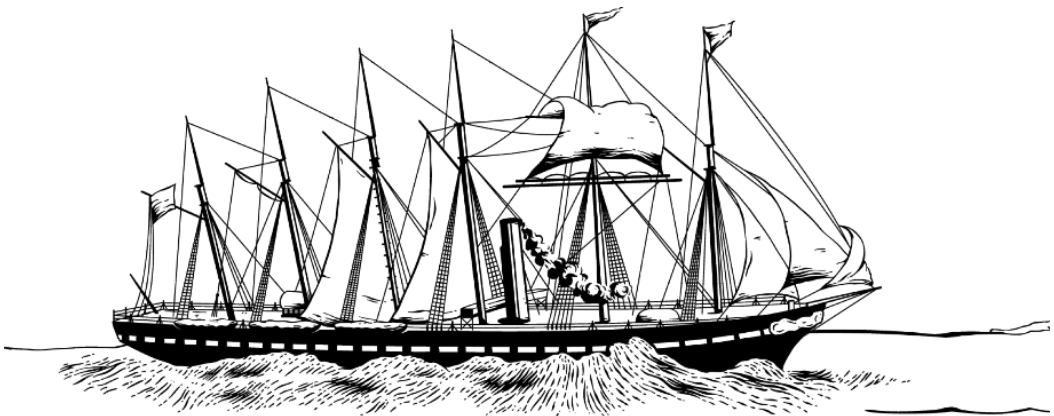

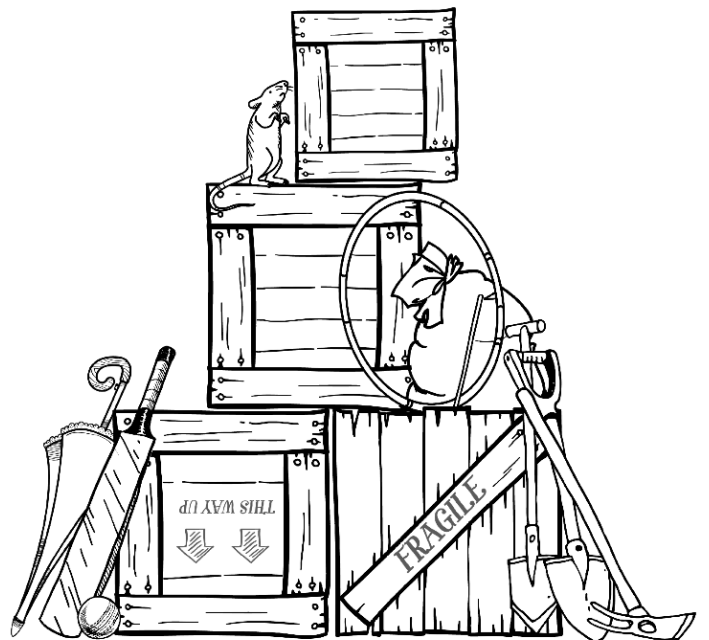
