**()** Suggested durations are given to help you plan your day

1: Entrance and Gift Shop Purchase tickets and visit the shop and café.

### 2: Dockyard Museum () 40 minutes

Discover the ship's extraordinary story. Dress up as Victorian passengers, steer the ship's course and raise the propeller as you prepare to board the SS Great Britain - the world's first great ocean liner.

### 3: Ship () 1 hour

Take in the sights, sounds and smells of life on board as you explore the cabins and saloons below deck. Try out a bunk for size. See the engine come to life. Meet crew and passengers and hear their stories.

### 4: Go Aloft! () 30 minutes

Discover Brunel's groundbreaking projects that changed the world and hear about his life. Compare your drawing skills with Brunel's. Sit in his Duke Street Office. And hear how his engineering work defined a new era of global travel.

### 7: Albion Dockyard **Viewing Area** () 15 minutes
