This guide describe the sounds, smells and Halloween additions we've made to the SS Great Britain this October Half Term.

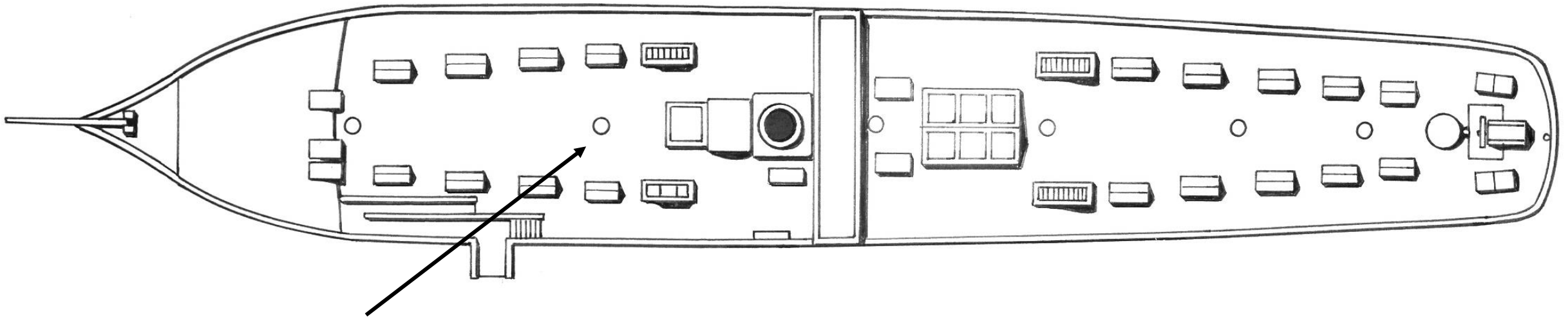

But don't be afraid! This guide will tell you where all the fake smells, sounds and Halloween models are on the ship.

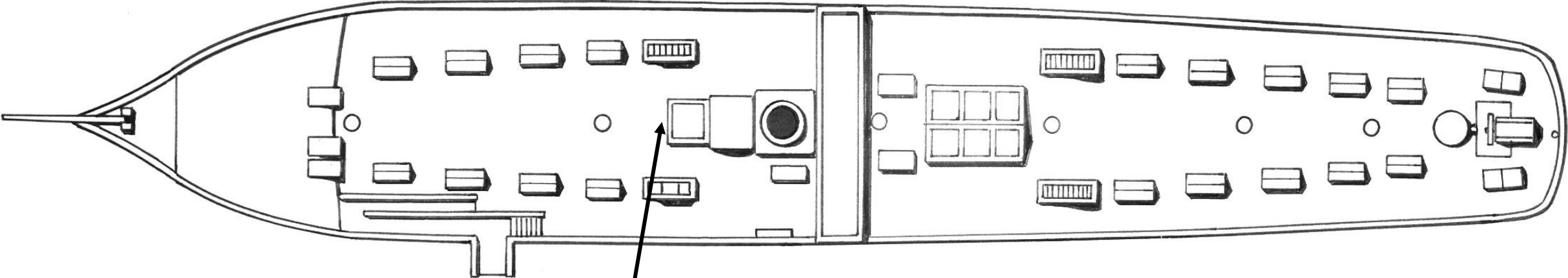
Top Deck - Sounds



Recorded sounds you will hear:

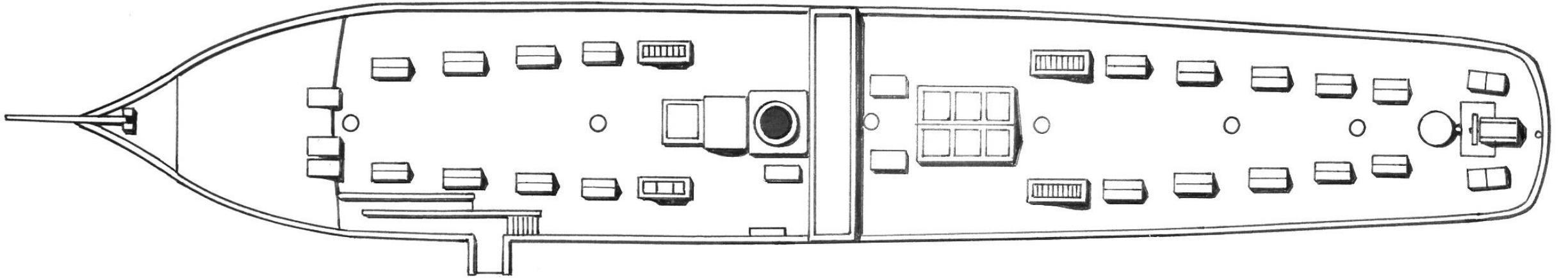
- Chains rattling

Bakery:

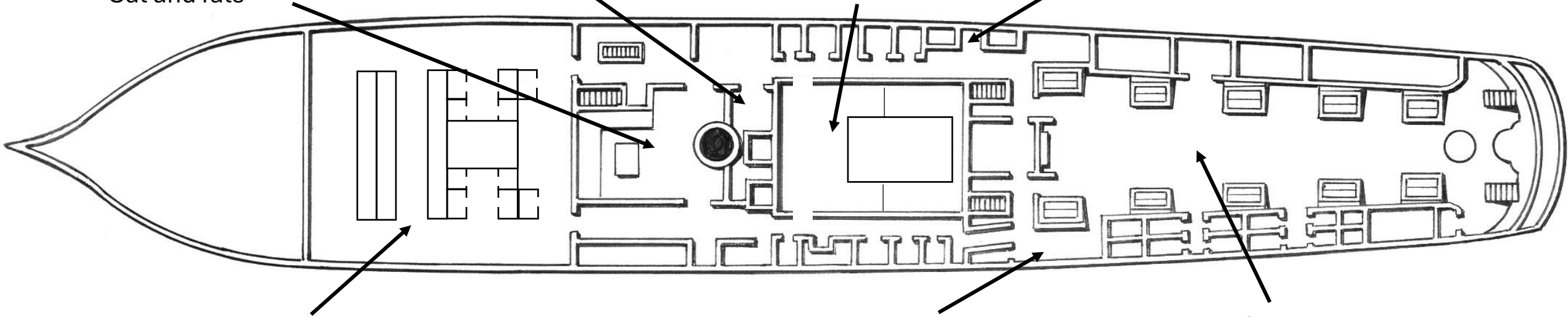
- Fire crackling

- Blood curdling scream

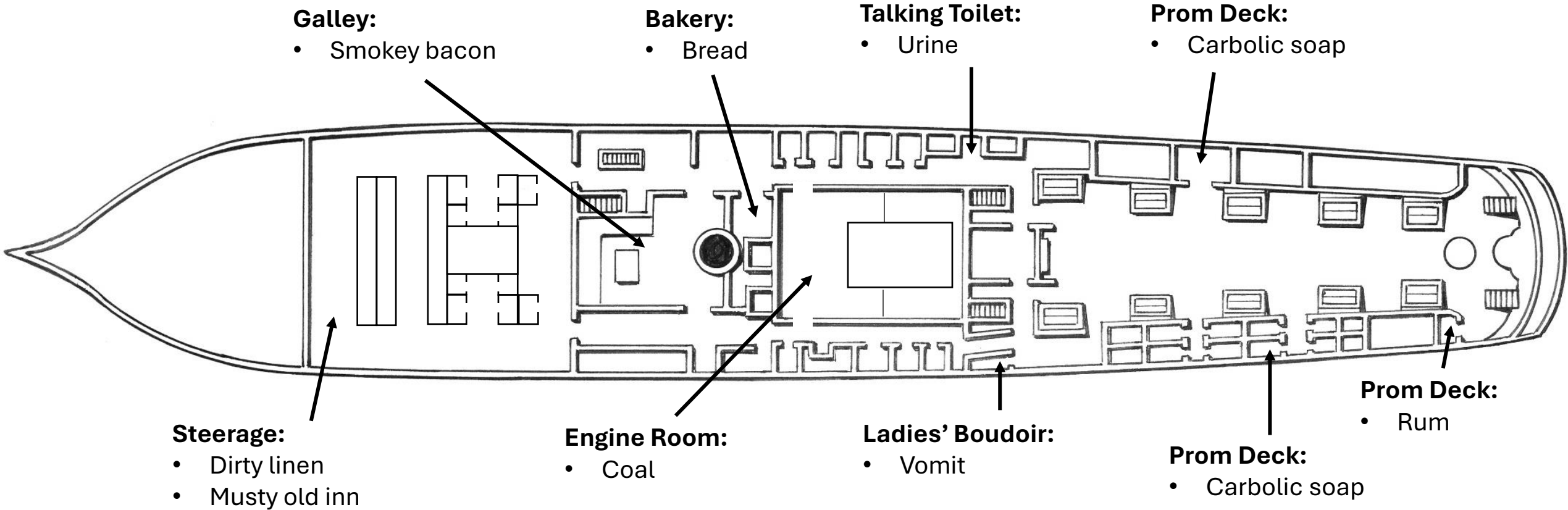
Ladies' Boudoir:

Middle Deck – Halloween Models



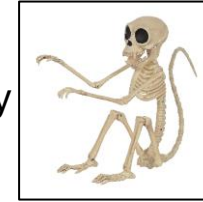
Galley:

- Carved turnip



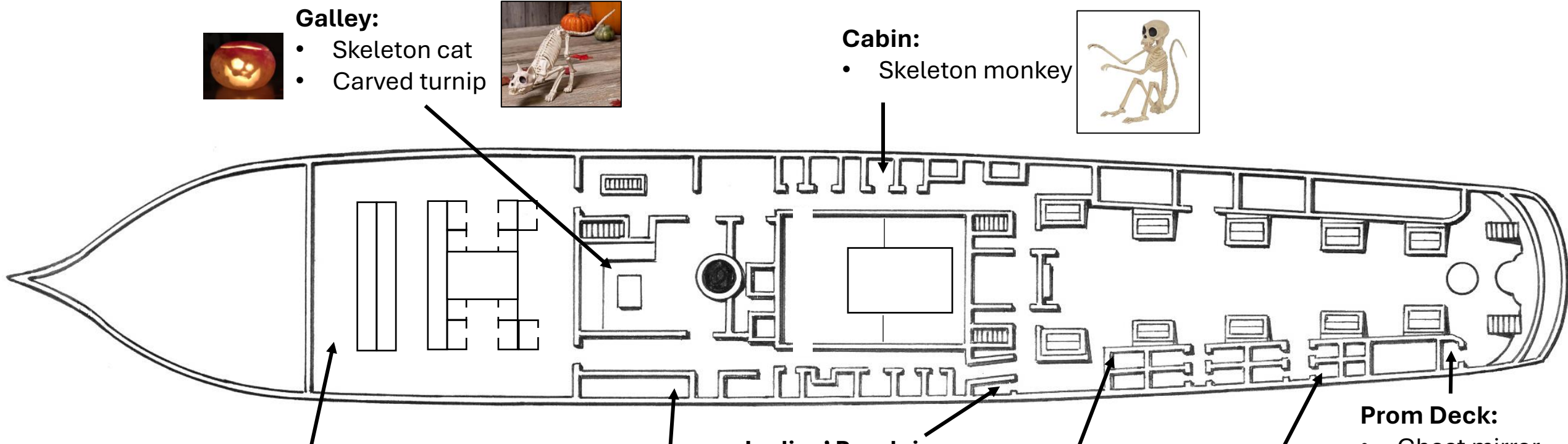
Prom Deck:

- Creepy doll

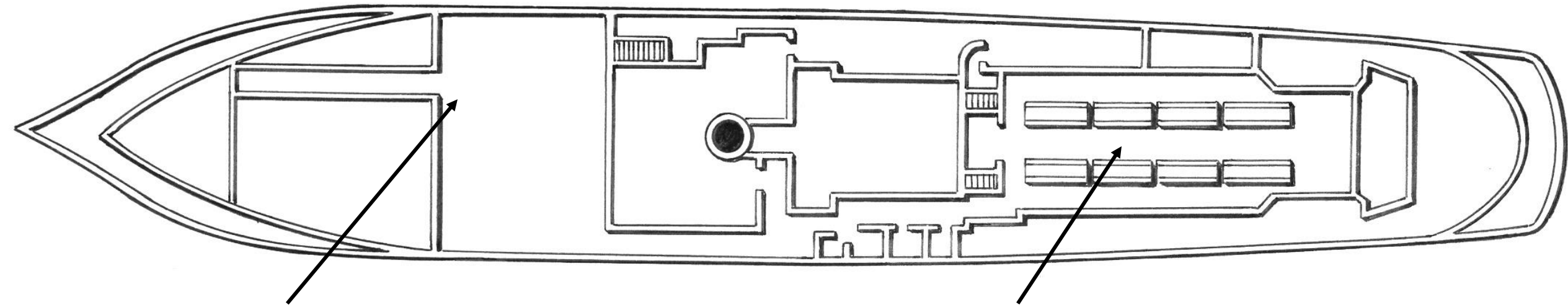


Prom Deck:

Lower Deck - Sounds



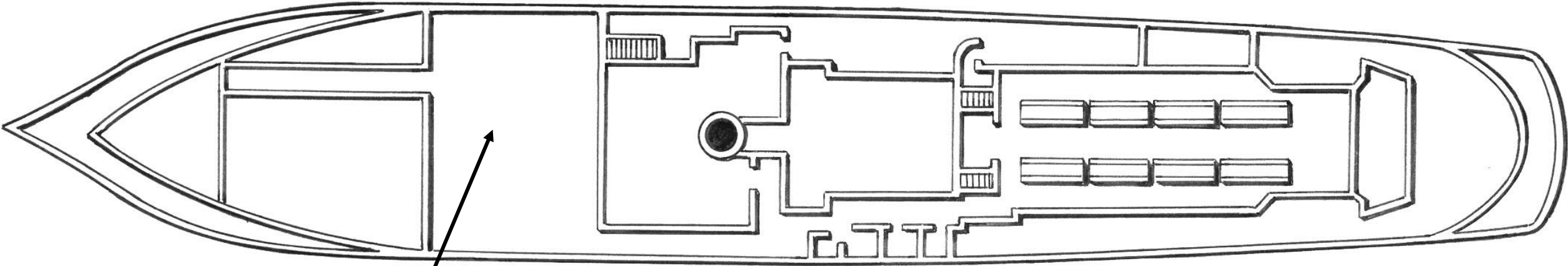
Forward Hold:

- Musicians warming up

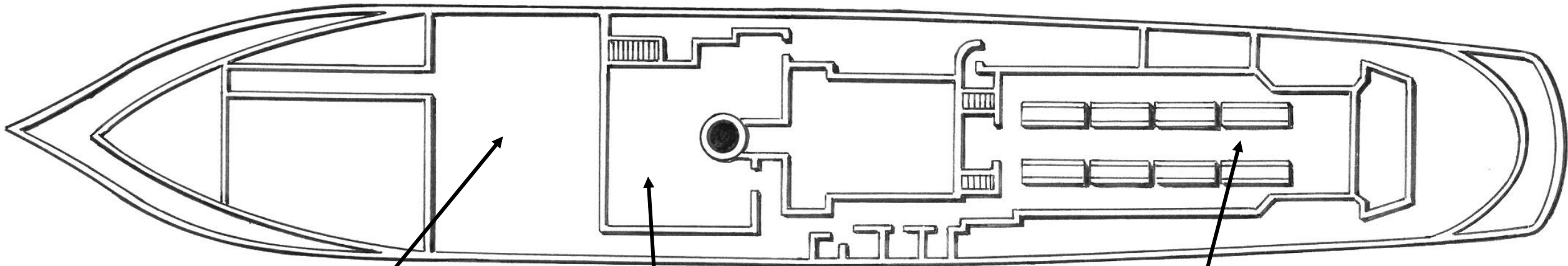
Lower Deck - Smells
