There are recorded sounds and artificial smells to help us imagine what life was like on the ship when it was sailing around the world from 1840s to 1880s.


In many of the rooms you will hear lots of different sounds at the same time.


#### Top Deck - Sounds *S*




Recorded sounds you will hear:

### Top Deck - Smells




# Middle Deck - Sounds ${ \widehat{\mathcal{Y}} }$




 Fainting sound of a sleigh landing on the deck above

- Horses
- You can also hear sounds from steerage above e.g. the baby crying
- Low hum from the dehumidifier

#### **Dining Saloon:**

- The sea
- The ship's engine, propeller and bell
- People moving and talking
- Seasick passengers
- Chinking of tableware moving
- Musicians warming up
